Due to the efforts of over 100 Guild volunteers, many visitors and members reported that the 2011 quilt show was, "the best ever." Plus, we even made some money which can be reinvested in black drapes and metal stand bases for the 2013 show. Here are some facts:

- We had a 20% increase in attendance to 1,200, with the furthest coming from Anchorage, Alaska.
- We had a 50% increase in admission fees equaling approximately \$6,000 resulting from a \$1 per person increase from \$4 to \$5 this year and 200 more paying visitors.

- Barb Magnuson asked if there were any members interested in participating in a Civil War Small Group. If you didn't have an opportunity to respond during the meeting, please contact Barb Magnuson.
- Sandra Steely and Jo Ann Moore announced that an

Appliqué Small Group has started and meets every 4th Monday of the Month at the Library.

- Jan Hickman (2012 Opportunity Tickets Sales) reminded everyone that the winner for the 2011 Quilt will be drawn at the December day meeting. It is imperative that any remaining tickets and any monies not yet turned in must be turned in no later than the first thing before the December meeting begins.

The attendance was the largest we have had to date and many thanks were given to Carol Lewis for providing many public announcements regarding the show this year. She also encouraged us to begin creating our Silent Auction and Country Store entries for the 2013 Quilt

Show.

Fat Quarters: Barb Tennison announced the winner for this month's fat quarter drawing was Marlene Gwaltney. And the What Was I Thinking fat quarter was won by Marilyn Rizzardo.

Community Quilts (Carmen Tesch):

- Displayed 2 quilts produced in response to last month's jelly roll quilt challenge.

- She also reminded everyone that has turned in a Community Quilt this year has had their name put into a special drawing that will be held during the December meeting. The prize was donated to us by Don Porretto.

The presentation this month was given by many of our members who went on the Houston Bus Trip. They gave descriptions of the show and their favorite recollections experienced on their trip.

Some final announcements were given:
