

Students wanted: Quilting 102/Triangle Tune-Up

Are you a fairly new quilter who wants to learn more advanced skills? Or are triangles just not working out for you? If so, you may be interested in the Hill 'N Hollow Quilt Guild's Quilting 102 class.

Taught by guild members Sharon Crozier and Vicki Kauth, the class features a table runner incorporating half-square and quarter-square triangles and flying geese as well as an on-point setting and mitered borders. Although there are many ways to make these units, Sharon and Vicki will teach one simple technique for each unit that requires no special equipment. So if a student decides to make something on a Saturday night, she or he won't have to wait for a quilt shop to open on Monday to get started.

Students MUST be able to cut fabric accurately using a rotary cutter and sew a consistent quarter-inch seam before taking this class. The class moves very quickly, and instructors won't have time to catch you up on these basics.
