## DEFINITIONS

1st Quilts – The first quilt constructed by a quilter.

2018 HNH Challenge – Items made for the 2018 Hill 'N Hollow guild challenge. Theme: Aww, Spring

2019 HNH Challenge – Items made for the 2019 Hill 'N Hollow guild challenge. Theme: It's an Adventure

2017 BOM Quilt – Quilts made for the 2017 Block of the Month from Margaret Wilburn's Pattern

2018 HNH Farm Girl Quilt Sew Along – Quilts made for the 2018 Sew Along. Theme: Farm Girl Vintage

Accessories and Wearable Art – Purses, totes, jackets, vests, and other items intended for use as apparel.

Appliqué – Quilts featuring either hand or machine appliqué as the primary design element.

Art Quilts – A work made by a quilter who makes a statement using the medium of the quilt. Quilts must be made of fabric, and have three layers held together with quilting stitches.

Block-of-the-Month (BOM) – The quilt-maker receives block patterns and the fabric to make the blocks either on a monthly basis or all at one time.

Group Quilts – Quilts made with the contributions of two or more quilters, including round-robins, block exchanges, assemblages of antique blocks, or other group projects. A quilt pieced or appliquéd by one person and quilted by another is not a group quilt. Please note: One ribbon per quilt will be awarded to individual listed as the Entrant.

Hand-Quilted Quilts – A quilt that is quilted entirely by hand.

Home Decor and 3-D Objects – Functional or decorative quilted objects. Examples: table runners, placemats (must submit at least two), Christmas tree skirts or stockings, door hangings, boxes and furniture.

Junior Quilter – A person aged 18 or younger who constructed the quilted item. No registration fee.

Kits – Quilts made from a kit where design and fabric choices are pre-selected for the quilt-maker.

Miniature Quilts – Scaled-down version of a larger quilt design; blocks no larger than 4"; no side of the quilt may be larger than 24".

Mixed Techniques – Quilts that feature a combination

of two or more techniques or styles ( ie. piecing and appliqué) as the primary design element, where one technique comprises 25% or more of the quilt.

Modern Quilt – Quilts that are inspired by modern design. Minimalism, asymmetry, expansive negative space, alternate grid work, improvisational piecing, bold colors and solid fabrics are often part of modern quilts.

Non-judged Items – Quilted items an event entrant wants to display, but not have judged. Perimeter must be 300" or less.

Original Design – Created personally by the quilt-maker. This does not include drafting your own version of a traditional block or making changes to another's design.

Other Techniques – Quilted items which do not fit in any other category, such as whole cloth quilts, embroidered quilts, yo-yo quilts or crazy quilts

Perimeter – The outside measurement of your quilt.  
Length + length + width + width = perimeter

Pieced – Quilts featuring standard piecing techniques, either by hand or machine, as the primary design element.

Preprinted Panels – A preprinted panel comprises more than 25% of the quilt top.

Professional Quilter – Someone who quilts or has quilted tops for others in exchange for fees, goods, or services.

Quilt – Hill' N Hollow Quilters Guild defines a quilt as three layers consisting of two layers of fabric and a filler held together with quilting stitches. The exception is a crazy quilt, which may consist of only two layers and may be tied.

Stationary Machine – The quilt is moved by hand while a sewing machine does the quilting.

Track-mounted Machine – The sewing machine is moved over the surface of a stationary quilt to do the quilting.

Traditional Quilts – Quilts based on traditional patterns and settings.

Whole Cloth Quilts -- Whole cloth quilts are not pieced or appliquéd and the pattern is created by the quilting.

# Rules

## Registration

- ◆ **Registration forms** are available at Guild meetings or by contacting Jodi McCray. Please read the rules below before completing the registration form. Completed registrations must be received or postmarked by midnight ***Friday, Sept. 13, 2019***. For each item entered, complete a registration form, attach a photograph in the space provided, and submit to Jodi McCray during a monthly Guild meeting, or by mail to:

- ◆ **Quantity Limits:** Each Entrant will be limited to 3 items per category and 15 entries overall.
- ◆ **Category:** Use Show Information and Definitions to select the correct category for each item registered. If you need assistance determining the correct category, please contact Jodi McCray. The guild reserves the right to move your quilt to a more appropriate category.
- ◆ **Photograph:** Attach a photograph to the Registration form in the space provided (it may be printed on plain paper) showing the main portion of your quilt for identification purposes. Registration forms that do not include a photograph will not be accepted.
- ◆ **Entrant:** The individual named on the Registration form as the person entering the quilt or quilted item in the show (usually the quilt owner).
- ◆ **Hanging Sleeve:** Every quilt, wall hanging and miniature quilt must have a hanging sleeve attached to the back. If an item has no sleeve, the entry will not be accepted. The top of the sleeve must be no more than 90" from the bottom of the quilt. Quilts more than 90" wide will need a split sleeve. The sleeve for bed quilts and wall quilts must be at least 4" deep and 3" deep for miniature quilts to accommodate hanging rods. Please contact Jodi McCray if you need hanging sleeve instructions.
- ◆ **Cleanliness:** All entries must be clean and free of debris and odor. Soiled or smelly quilts will not be accepted. Please check your quilt before turning it in to avoid the transfer of dirt, pet hair or odors to another entrant's quilt.
- ◆ **No telephone or fax entries will be accepted.**
- ◆ **No late entries will be accepted.**
- ◆ **No incomplete entries will be accepted.**

## Fees

- ◆ Entries are free for Hill 'N Hollow Quilters Guild members who paid 2019 dues by June 30, 2019.
- ◆ **Non-guild members** are welcome to register quilts and quilted items in the show for an entry fee of \$10 for each item entered (except for the Junior Quilter category). Entry fees must be included with the Registration form.
- ◆ **Make checks or money orders** for entry fees payable to Hill 'N Hollow Quilters Guild.

## Judging

- ◆ Quilts entered in the show for judging must have been completed since October 2017. Quilts previously judged in a Hill 'N Hollow Quilt Show are not eligible to be judged.
- ◆ Decisions of the judge and/or quilt show committee will be final.
- ◆ There will be no automatic awards. If only one item is entered in a category, it will be awarded a ribbon only if it is worthy of an award in the judge's opinion.
- ◆ The judge may move your entry to another category if she/he considers it more appropriate for judging purposes.

## Turn-In and Labeling

- ◆ All items in the show must be properly tagged for identification .
- ◆ A label listing the Entrant must be attached to each and every item.
- ◆ The label may be permanent or temporary.
- ◆ Do not bring your entries to the show in a plastic garbage bag.
- ◆ Attach quilt show Confirmation Form:
  - Put the pink copy of the Quilt Show Confirmation in a sandwich-sized zippered plastic bag.
  - With the back of the Confirmation Form displayed and the baggie opening to the right, pin the baggie at its top and bottom to the back of the quilt in the lower right corner (as viewed from the back of the quilt).
  - DO NOT pin through the pink slip.
  - Bring the white and yellow copies with you at turn in. The yellow copy will be returned to you for identification when you pick up your quilt after the show.
- ◆ Please help us protect your entry. If it can be damaged through folding or other handling, please attach it to cardboard or help us protect it in some other way.

## Pick-Up

- ◆ No item may be removed before the show closes.

- ◆ All items must be checked out by a member of the show committee before being removed from the show.
- ◆ **No item will be released without the yellow copy of its entry Confirmation form.**

## Sale of Show Items

- ◆ All entries may be offered for sale through the Country Store.
- ◆ Sales tax will be collected on all sales made at the show.
- ◆ **Members:** Hill 'N Hollow Quilters Guild shall retain an 12% donation on all items sold by guild members who donate a minimum of four hours before, during, or after the show. Otherwise, a 17% donation will be retained on all items sold.
- ◆ **Non-members:** Hill 'N Hollow Quilters Guild shall retain a 17% donation on all items sold by non-members.

## Insurance

- ◆ Hill 'N Hollow Quilters Guild does not insure quilt show entries for damage, loss or theft. We have procedures and processes in place to assure your entry is safe from harm and accounted for at all times. Most homeowners or renters insurance policies cover items while away from your residence. Please review your personal insurance policy for coverage of your quilt show entries while in our care.

## Dates to Remember

- ◆ **Registration Deadline:** Friday, Sept. 13, 2019: Completed registration forms must be mailed and postmarked no later than midnight on this date.
- ◆ **Quilt Show Confirmations:** Friday, Oct. 11, 2019: Quilt Show Confirmation forms to be attached to entries will be distributed at the October guild meeting. Unclaimed confirmations can be picked up at turn-in.
- ◆ **Quilt Turn-In:** Sunday, Oct, 13, 2019, between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m. Entrants will deliver their items to the Seventh Day Adventist Church located at 3744 Highway 62 West in Mountain Home.
  - If you cannot deliver your items, please arrange to have a friend deliver them.
  - Be sure to bring both the yellow and white copies of the Quilt Show Confirmation Form; the yellow copy will be returned to you at check-in.
- ◆ **Quilt Pick-Up:** Saturday, Oct. 19, 2019, 4-5 p.m.
  - Entrants will pick up their items from the Baxter County Fairgrounds.
  - If you cannot pick up your items, please arrange to have a friend pick them up.
  - No item will be released unless the person picking it up has the yellow copy of the Confirmation Form.

Please note: We encourage you to enter any quilt you think will be completed by the turn-in date. Please let us know by Oct. 1 if you need to withdraw a quilt because it won't be completed in time for the show.
