1. Item can be no larger than a baby quilt (approximately 36" x 44").
2. It can be a rectangle, square, triangle, circle or a combination of those. It can be a three-dimensional item.
3. Embellish with beads, buttons, lace, yarn or whatever makes you think about your favorite season.
4. Try to use at least 50% fabric, and other items from your stash. Now is a good time to clean out the fabric stash to make room for more!!!!

Remember to keep your item a secret from others.

Northwest Arkansas Extension Homemakers Quilters Workshop

As those who were at the January meeting will recall, Hill 'N Hollow Quilters Guild will be sponsoring one day (March 3) of the Northwest Arkansas Extension Homemakers Quilt Workshop. (See more information later in the newsletter.)

Our Guild will present a program, *Basics of Quilting*. This is to include what you need to get started such as mats, cutters, thread, fabric, lighting, how to check that your seam is actually $\frac{1}{4}$ ", starch or no starch, launder before cutting or not, and whatever else we can think of! This can be a one-presenter or several. I'd appreciate someone stepping up to do this.

We will also be presenting two short "Quilting College" presentations for those attendees who are interested. One is to be *Fabric Selection Guidelines* (with samples) and perhaps guidelines on other quilting-related items. The second will be on Terminology & Acronyms w/handouts and Fat Quarter Cutting Options.

Also needed are:

- Donations of items for a raffle basket. The profits from the sale of tickets go to our guild.
- Donations worth at least around \$10 and up for door prizes.

HILL 'N HOLLOW QUILTERS GUILD GUILD MEETING January 14, 2022

Attendees: 37

President Ann Wilson called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed everyone.

She announced that we will be meeting at the Seventh-day Adventist Church until further notice. Since we have prepaid six months at the Food Bank, we will use the facility for smaller guild functions, such as Quilt Congress classes.

She also announced that Vicki Kauth will be purchasing a new computer for the guild.

New Officers: for 2022, Rosita Forster, Vice-President, Jodi McCray, Treasurer and Maureen Forster, Secretary. President-Elect position is still open.

An up-to-date Officers and Committee Chairs List has been posted on our website. Carol Lewis has volunteered to Co-Chair Membership and collected membership dues at the meeting.

Secretary's Minutes: Motion: by Vicki Kauth and seconded by Margie Dotson that the minutes of the December 10, 2021, guild meeting be approved. Approved. **Treasurer's Report:** Jodi McCray read the Treasurer's Report. **Motion:** by Elaine Byng and seconded by Charity Beckley to approve the report. Approved. It will be filed for audit.

Birthdays and Anniversaries: Congratulations to members celebrating birthdays, (presented with fabric cupcake) and anniversaries.

Audit Committee Report: Charity Buckley said the report is posted online. Ann Wilson is filling in for the position of President-Elect on Audit Committee.

Communications: Peggy Moody reported a savings of approximately \$200/yr over 5 years through a change in computer services. She will be changing the password for Members Only information in March. Regarding Group Works Incentive Program, she said there were not enough members belonging to United Healthcare Insurance for us to join.

Community Quilts: Charity Beckley was sitting in for Sandy Beasley and announced she had batting available for quilts.

Branson Retreat: Dianne Petty said there were 13 slots open, and she would be opening registration to non-members on Monday. Members who registered were invited to call the hotel directly and book their rooms.

Hospitality: Margie Dotson introduced Dianne Siddons who is in charge of this year's Challenge "*My Favorite Season in the Ozarks.*" It should be no larger than baby quilt size and reveal date has not been determined. Margie Dotson also said that refreshments would continue to be provided at meetings by those having a birthday that month, but anyone can bring something any time they wish.

Membership: Carol Lewis needs a Co-Chair for Membership. She also needs quilts from guild activities to show in a trunk show on April 13 at the Nimble Thimbles Quilt Guild Show in Cabot, AR. Examples would be quilts from Challenges, Quilt Alongs, Best Workmanship at Baxter County Fairs, 2019 Ribbons Winners, Raffle Quilts, Presidents Quilts, 2-3 Community Quilts and Members Teaching Members quilts.

Education: In Eileen Burg's absence, Ann Wilson reported on Programs for 2022. In July the program is *Christmas in July* and will feature past Christmas quilts and offer new ideas for Christmas 2022.

Library: Our library may be discontinued due to storage problems. When asked about donations to Donald Reynolds Library, Vicki Kauth explained their policy.

Workshops: Virginia Cornett announced a lecture and workshop April 7, and 8, 2022, called "*It's All In The Sashing*" by Barbara Eikmeier. Cost is \$30 for members and there is a maximum of 20 students. Registration sheet is available.

Sit 'N Sew: Is held 3rd Tuesday of each month at the Seventh-day Adventist Church. A Beginner Quilter Class is planned. It is offered free to members. Volunteers are needed to teach.

Members Teaching Members: Classes will be announced. Volunteer teachers are requested. Classes will cost members \$10/class, with a minimum of 5 students, after payment of rent, half the remaining funds going to the teacher.

Raffle Quilt 2022: Vicki Kauth distributed ballots with several suggested names. The winning name "*Midnight Stars.*"

20 Year Member Recognition: A committee to organize this is requested.

Newsletter: This is Margie Dotson's last year doing the Newsletter. She is looking for a volunteer to take over next year. She is willing help them in any way she can.
