## GUILD MEETING

June 10, 2022

### **Attendees: 51**

**Announcements:** Vice President Rosita Forster explained the library silent auction, the 25+ Year Recognition sign-up sheets, other sign-up sheets available for Quilt Congress volunteers, and Show & Tell, and the location of Harriet (suggestion box). Forms for suggestions were on each table.

President Ann Wilson called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed everyone.

**Secretary's Minutes: Motion:** by Elaine Byng and seconded by Charity Beckley to approve minutes of May 13, 2022, meeting. Approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** Jodi McCray went over the Treasurer's Report which is posted online. It will be filed for audit.

**Birthdays/Anniversaries:** were recognized and applauded.

**New Members/Guests:** There were no new members or guests.

**Officers:** Rosita Forster has agreed to be President-Elect for 2022. **Motion:** by Roxine Burch and seconded by Trieneke Self to approve. Approved. Angela Lindberg has agreed to be President-Elect for 2023.

**Library:** Roxine Burch of Library Liquidation Committee said Silent Auction is first of three auctions planned to liquidate library. She explained the auction procedure for the day.

**Meeting Venues:** Board will be meeting at Farmers & Merchants Bank (free of charge), Guild meetings will be held at Food Bank and Members Teaching Members will be held at Seventh-day Adventist Church Fellowship Hall. Charity Beckley said a lot of possible venues have been investigated. Any member may check on possible venues and place suggestions in Harriet.

**20+ Year Recognition:** Rosita Forster said the event will take place at the December 9, 2022, meeting. A sign-up sheet for volunteers to serve on the planning committee is available.

**2023 Retreat:** Reservations have been made for the hall. Volunteers are needed to be on the planning committee. Sheets are available or contact Rosita Forster.

**Social Committee:** It was proposed that social events would be spontaneous. Check Newsletter for events, or Eblasts will be sent out.

**Quilt Congress:** Ann Wilson said she brought some samples of placemats, auction baskets, decorations. Volunteers are needed and sign-up sheets were available. Carol Lewis requested help for making and distributing 5" x 5" fabric announcements. She urged members to register early and not wait until September or October because teachers need to estimate kits, etc. People needing a ride can contact Carol. Inquiry received on anyone having an APQS System. No one has one.

**Hand Quilters:** Peggy Moody said she received a request for ladies to demonstrate hand quilting in Hardy. Anyone interested can contact Peggy.

**Audit Report:** Charity Beckley said report for the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter was sent to Peggy Moody to put online. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Audit Report will be filed next month. Charity requested members to fill out Reimbursement Forms completely, with appropriate signatures.

**Communications:** Peggy Moody said we still need a Newsletter editor to replace Margie Dotson who is moving. Margie was applauded for the excellent job she has done. Thank you, Margie.

**Community Quilts:** Sandy Beasley said 8 quilts were donated today. She said recipient charities were listed online. A new charity *“Into the Light”* (against sex trafficking) was voted to be added by the Board. Twin size quilts are needed for Hospice and larger (double or queen) are needed for Serenity House. Quilts should be finished and labeled. If you are unable to finish a quilt, we will try and find someone to finish it. Donations towards quilting costs are appreciated.

**Raffle Quilt:** Diana Arian filled in for Patti Kratz. June’s prize was awarded to Vicki Kauth who sold \$115. July’s prize will be a jelly roll and some border fabric.

**Education:** Member Teaching Member classes are listed online. There are five classes remaining in the year. Ann Wilson explained her collage class is different than the one she is teaching for Quilt Congress. She showed some samples. Other class samples were shown.

**Hospitality:** Margie Dotson encouraged everyone to sign up for 50/50 and door prizes.

**Membership:** Carol Lewis reported membership is 87.

**Raffle Quilt Ticket Sale Venues:** Sign-up sheets available. Farmer’s Market tomorrow. (Outdoors). Baxter County Fair, and Stone Creek Art Festival, both indoor and air-conditioned.

**Announcements:** Angela Lindberg is currently acting in *“Steel Magnolias”* at Twin Lakes Theater.

Carolyn Crawford is seeking someone to make a T-shirt quilt.
