Challenge Quilt Rules:

You may use any technique or combination of techniques such as traditional piecing, applique, paint stick, photo transfer, thread painting, etc. Embellish as desired.

Quilts must consist of three layers and be machine or hand quilted.

Quilts should embrace, reference or be inspired by the Challenge Theme.

The quilt can be any shape: round, square, triangle, rectangle, etc., with a maximum perimeter of 120 inches.

Entries must be clean and odor free when they are received or they may be returned without consideration for the competition.

The quilt must have a 4" hanging sleeve.

You may use a commercial pattern

Your name must appear on the back of the quilt for identification.

All quilts must be picked up at the Congress. If you cannot pickup your quilt, please make arrangements for someone else to do so. Pick-up person's name must be on the Entry Form below.

She has published patterns and books, including *Dresden Quilt Block Reimagined*.

Bring your willingness to be creative and step a little outside the box. It will be tons of creative fun and easy for all from confident beginner up. Create your own, unique small wall hanging using the *Dresden Quilt Blocks Reimagined* book.

In class we will cover the basic Dresden blocks and then some of the Dresden 201 blocks which allow for creative piecing. Your choice. You can start with a background of your choice or wait until your blocks are made. A 40" X 40" background is suggested. It can be pieced or solid.

Modern Dresden Supply List

Supplies	Fabrics
Sewing machine with 1/4" foot in working order	Suggest picking a theme: Springtime, African, Kaffe Fassett, polka dot, batik, etc.
Basic Sewing Supplies: neutral thread pms npper scissors marking tool	For plates: Minimum- 8-10 half yard pieces for a combination of fabrics you love. Bring more, if you have it & like lots of variety. You can mix it up with 1/4 & 1/2 yard cuts of more fabrics. We'll work with what is there. They should have great contrast & a variety of values and prints. 1 or 2 should have great motifs for centers. Fat quarter bundles are perfect.
Point turner or purple thing Cutting Mat Your regular rotary cutter 28mm rotary cutter (good for cutting around circle templates) Freezer paper 18"	Background: If planning to piece your background, please do so before class to make a 36" X 36" or 40" X 40" square. In addition, you can do a rectangle like a wall hanging or baby quilt. It is okay if you prefer to not have the background yet, as you may change your mind.

Pellon 906F fusible lightweight interfacing 18" piece	Check out this video on more about Dresdens https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=NjnAwvVNEO
Cardboard or card stock rectangle, about 4" X 6", or Options: Susan Cleveland's Prairie Point Turner or Clover Hot Hemmer	Optional Precutting Fabrics Cut strips from contrasting fabrics
Electrical extension cord	Set #1: (2) 6" wide strips from length of fat quarter (6 x 22") and place right sides together (RST)
<i>Dresden Quilt Blocks Reimagined</i> book, suggested (Candyce will have available in class)	Set #2: (2) 6-1/2" wide strips from length of fat quarter & place RST.
Optional, but helpful: Pressing ham, design wall (Candyce will have pressing bars in class)	Set #3: (2) 7" wide strips from WOF (width of fabric) and place RST. (10) 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles from each fabric for total of 20 facings

The materials in the collage can be fused, glued or stitched in place. All you will need for this workshop is a sharp pair of scissors, pen, pencil, and a fun attitude.

In this class, you will learn how to make a folded fabric ornament using the Basic Star pattern from The Ornament Girl.

NO SEWING MACHINE REQUIRED! Registration fee includes a kit with all the supplies you need to make one ornament. Once you learn how to make the basic triangle fold, you'll be able to make many more beautiful ornaments. Come learn some tips and tricks, and where to get your supplies.

A different kind of "stash buster". Sound interesting? Join this workshop for a **fun** and unusual way to look at a scrap quilt.

I've used my batik fabric collection. Also, Christmas and oriental fabric work well. Each looks so different. Any combination will work well. A truly scrap quilt would be awesome... just looking for a little contrast between blocks.

I used 8 1/2" block and 1" x 8 1/2" strips. Try it for a table runner, throw, or full quilt.

Bring to class:

Sewing machine with 1/4" foot

Small cutting mat (can be shared)

Ruler

Rotary cutter

Neutral thread
