


President's Corner

Valley Ranch Quilt-Along

What Colors Will YOU Choose?

I hope you are considering playing along with our Valley Ranch Quilt-Along in 2025. So far, 13 intrepid guild members have signed up for this combination beginner class and quilting skills tune-up.

Your purchase of the \$20 pattern gets you in. In addition to two website links per month to Edyta Sitar's excellent instructions, your participation includes access to informal meetings following our February through August guild meetings. These meetings will begin at 1 p.m. and last until 4 or so; if no one shows up, I'll head home around 1:30. This will be a great

opportunity to ask questions, seek help with problems or just bring in your sewing machine and a personal project to sew with your friends, all at no extra charge. The February meeting is aimed at beginners and will focus on tools, fabrics, how to cut fabric and how to read a pattern. We'll also talk about ¼" seams.

Of course, you can participate without going through the guild. The pattern is available through Edyta's website (<u>laundrybasketquilts.com</u>), and the videos are posted on YouTube. But I'll be making a bulk order of patterns following the January guild meeting. Purchasing through the guild will get you a printed pattern without shipping changes. You can also purchase a download from Edyta to save shipping charges.

The picture below shows the fabrics I've pulled from my stash for the quilt. I'm sure I'll be adding more fabrics as the quilt progresses.

HILL 'N HOLLOW QUILTERS GUILD MEETING MINUTES – December 13, 2024

Attendees: 51 Members and 1 Guest

President Angie Lindberg welcomed everyone calling the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.

Members celebrating December birthdays received a fat quarter cupcake. Angie was also recognized for her 50th birthday today with a tiara and sash. Wedding Anniversaries were also recognized with special recognition for Randy and Mona Bolen's 50th anniversary celebrated on December 7th.

Judith Ericksen announced that Marge Schill made 5 quilted items for the Visually Impaired Persons, Inc. program. Thank you, Marge!

Angie shared a joke: Why was the letter E the only letter to get a Christmas Card? Because all the other letters were "Not E" (naughty)...

November Guild Minutes - Motion made by Mona Bolen to approve the minutes, seconded by Vicki Kauth. **Motion passed.**

November Treasurer's Report – There were no concerns, report was filed for audit.

<u>Announcements</u>

- 2025 Membership Dues increase to \$40 and are due by January 15
- Challenge Quilts due today, see Diane Siddons as voting will happen at break
- The Twin Lakes Playhouse fundraiser brought in \$1,310 WAY TO GO!
- Hospitality Chair Darlene Landrum thanked the following members for their support this year and presented those in attendance with small glass-made gifts by Steve Landrum: Judith Ericksen, Virginia Cornett, Donna Perrin, Emily Duncan, Mary Jo Smith, Marge Schill, Clara Ziegler, Jackie Cochran and Trieneke Self. Darlene also thanked Jodi McCray, Vicki Williamson and Rosita Forster for their help as the December Brunch Committee and they too received glass-made gifts.
- Vicki Kauth shared the 2025 Quilt-Along, Edyta Sitar's Valley Ranch Quilt. This free class for members with in-person support will take place after each guild meeting but participants must purchase the \$20 pattern. See Vicki for more information.
- We still have openings for 2025 Officer Positions. Please see Randy if you can help.

<u>2025 Quilt Show</u> – Chair Marion Bogden announced that we are in the planning stage but if we do not have enough people to run the quilt show by March 1st the show will be cancelled.

Marion confirmed that the Fairgrounds building is reserved for October 21-26, 2025, with the show set for 24-26. Paula Bailey, Fair Manager, apologized for the delay in responding as fairground phones were down due to storm damage.

There are 9 positions filled at this time. Public Relations: Peggy Moody; Ribbons: Ginger Alexander; Hospitality: Mona Bolen and Diane Siddons; Games: Angie Lindberg; Set-Up/Tear Down: Steve Landrum and Randy Bolen; Demonstrations: Peggy Moody, Darlene and Steve Landrum; Vendors: Clara Ziegler; Judging: Darlene Landrum; Registration: Sharon Crozier BUT ONLY if she has help otherwise, she will step down. There are still 13 positions open: Store, Registration, Turn-In/Out, Appraiser Selector (includes housing). Community Quilts will have a booth set up.

Marion shared the following ideas and asked members to think about them and be prepared for discussion at the January meeting:

- 1. Other categories, i.e. Recycled Category: T-shirts, jeans, memory quilts. Kids Category: non-members with no entry fee. No Veteran Behind Left Category: This would include a booth for non-members to enter with their understanding that these quilts are donations.
- 2. Approaching businesses for sponsorships, i.e. Pizza Hut to feed Care Center Ministry workers; businesses would get advertising at the show. Some member comments were made that we are not a "non-profit" 501(c)3 but we are a 501(c)4 and businesses would not be able to write off their contributions for tax purposes.
- 3. Selling T-shirts with a funny saying and design to the public; members could have the same shirt but with Hill 'N Hollow emblems. She asked about Ann Wilson's research on T-shirts. Rosita Forster shared Ann had presented a quote to the 2023 Board but from a vendor in Salem. But it was decided to use a local business, and it went no further. Marion said she could handle the T-shirts.

Marion finished with Mother Theresa's Quote, "I can do things you cannot, you can do things I cannot; together we can do great things."

<u>President's Quilt</u> - Joyce Linhoff shared it is a tradition to thank the President at the December Guild Meeting with a special quilt top. The President is offered their choice of block style and fabric colors. Members make a personalized block and then volunteer members put the top together. Joyce presented Angie with her quilt top: red floating churn dash blocks on a background of white with members' personal touches at the center of each block. Angie was very touched and thankful for the beautiful quilt top.

<u>Raffle Quilt</u> - \$5,900 was raised!! Angie apologized for not having the "pie in the face" for all those who sold over \$100 of tickets due to church restrictions. In lieu of that, Carolyn Bisbee

provided a piece of pumpkin pie to each one with a special gift to the top sellers: Vicki Kauth at \$336 and Angie Lindberg at \$335. The other members who sold over \$100 worth of tickets were: Carol Lewis, Frieda Mauthe, Jodi McCray, Cindy Albright, Donna Armstrong, Randy Bolen, Connie Martin and Katie Risk.

<u>Transfer of Leadership</u> – Before Angie handed over the Guild's gavel, she wanted to give special thanks to the Bolen's for making her a personalized gavel with her name and President 2024 engraved on it. Angie also thanked Terry and Jonna Butler for a beautiful wood-turned cookie tray (made by Terry) and lovely embroidered napkins by Jonna. Angie reminded us that her theme for this year was "Fun, Friendship and Growth". She wanted to thank the Board Members, all Committee Chairs and all those who filled in for their support and hard work this past year.

As incoming President, Randy stated that we only have as 2025 Officers himself and President-Elect, Clara Ziegler. We cannot have a Guild without all officer positions filled. There are still Committee Chair and Sub-Committee Chair positions open. The current positions filled are Education sub-committee Programs: Carol Lewis, Workshop: Darlene Landrum. Peggy Moody will be handling some of the sub-committee positions under Communications. With 90 members, we should be able to fill these spots. He understands that many have already served, and others may feel unequipped. We are not a Guild of one or two, but of many. We are not in a good position, and he does not want this Guild to shut down so please come talk to him.

Carolyn Bisbee prepared to pull the winning ticket for Raffle Quilt 2024. She asked Randy to come draw the winning ticket as our new President. With several spins of the drum, Randy pulled a ticket. What a fantastic draw of this beautiful quilt winner to a very deserving and hard-working member: Carolyn Bisbee! Congratulations Carolyn and may you truly enjoy it!

<u>Challenge Quilt</u> - Diane Siddons announced there were 17 entries for this year and these quilts will be given to local veterans in hospice care and nursing homes. The top 3 winning quilts will be held for display at Quilt Show 2025. Votes revealed these top winners: 3rd Place Peggy Moody, 2nd Place Sharon Crozier, 1st Place Cindy Albright

Randy called all Ugly Christmas Sweater contest participants up front. There were 9 entries and with a raise of hands, Jodi McCray was declared the winner. The other 8 participants received poinsettia plants that served as table centerpieces.

The Community Quilt Parade displayed 11 lovely quilts.

Show and Tell provided members with the opportunity to show their wonderful quilts.

Winners: Door Prizes: Jodi McCray and Diane Siddons. 50/50 Emily Duncan won \$25

Adjournment: Motion by Angie Lindberg and seconded by Rosita Forster. Motion passed. Adjourned at 11:14 a.m. Enjoy the Holiday Brunch! Special cakes were available after the brunch for members to enjoy. Angie's birthday cake was made by Mona Bolen and the Bolen anniversary cake was provided by Rosita Forster.
